Kay could not afford the few cents for the bus trip home from school in Cebu-City, Philippines, so the 12-year-old sat on the lap of a classmate in the crowded *jeepney*. The only adult on the makeshift bus was a middle-aged woman sitting across him. Judging by her uniform, Kay guessed she was a teacher. 5

While the *jeepney* was stopped at a red light on Manalili Street, Kay saw a man sneak up behind the woman, reach through the open side of the vehicle and grab her gold earrings. As the light turned green, the thief casually walked into an alley in the Ermita *barangay*, a notoriously dangerous slum. 10

When the woman cried for help, nobody seemed to care. At that moment, Kay understood how his own victims felt when he stole from food stalls in Carbon public market.

Immediately, he asked the *jeepney* driver to stop. He jumped from the vehicle and followed the robber, who was wearing a distinctive red shirt, into the *barangay*. 15

Each time the thief turned to see if he was being followed, Kay pretended to be buying something from a sidewalk vendor or hid behind a concrete column.

After tailing the thief for more than five minutes, Kay saw Sergeant Ino talking to two other officers. The boy asked them to arrest the man in the red shirt, but at first they did not take him seriously. "You should arrest the robber because you are a policeman," Kay burst out. "That's your job, isn't it?" 20

Convinced that the boy was telling the truth, the three men approached the thief, who threw the earrings away in an attempt to avoid being caught. Kay retrieved them while the *barangay* officers arrested the thief. 25

Kay's heroism earned him a 500-peso reward from his school principal. With the money, he treated his classmates to ice-cream. In addition, a local charity, the Ramon Aboitiz Foundation, gave him a four-year college scholarship so he can pursue his dream of becoming a police officer. 30

Williem was on his way home from school. It was the beginning of a cool and quiet evening – it seemed a little too quiet. There was no sound of anything moving except ... Williem suddenly stopped! There was a sound, a sound he dreaded, a sound that could bring disaster.

It was the sound of water. It was not loud, only a trickle, but Williem knew that the trickle would grow; it would become a gurgle, then a little stream, then a river, a rushing torrent. And the sea would roar over the land, sweeping away everything from barns to houses in an angry flood. 5

Williem tried to look for help but the man who inspected that part of the dike would not be back for another three to four hours. Williem thought of going back to the village to look for help but it would take far too long. There was only one thing to do, and Williem did it. 10

He found the spot from which the water was coming – a tiny gap, a leak that could be plugged with a finger. He put his finger in the hole, and the water stopped. 15

For a while, he felt happy, even heroic. It pleased him to think that one small boy could hold back the North Sea. Minutes ticked away then hours passed, Williem began to worry. No one had come by and it seemed that no one would pass for hours. It was growing dark. Dinnertime came and passed.

"Help!" he shouted. "Help! The dike! The dike!" But the wind and waves drowned his voice. Night had arrived and there was frost in the air. 20

Williem thought of a hundred things; of his home, of the cheerful flames in the fireplace, of his mother wondering what had happened to him, of how long it would be until someone would find him. He thought of everything except taking his finger from the dike. He began to tremble. His teeth chattered, his finger hurt, his hand pained him, his arm began to feel cramped. His right side felt numb, his legs were weak. But he stamped his feet, and rubbed his freezing arm with his left hand to keep the blood flowing. Though he felt dizzy, he stiffened his weakening legs, he stood erected and kept his finger in the hole in the dike. 25 30

When he finally saw a man coming with a lantern, he fainted.

It was his father with some people from the village. They lifted Williem from the ground and saw water dripping from the hole.

The leak was soon effectively plugged, the dike was strengthened and a good part of Holland was saved from a fatal flood. 35

Williem became a never-forgotten legend, part of the history of Holland – the boy who stopped the sea.
